Program Service Impact

Day of Caring

- 1,600+ volunteers formed 72 teams
- Completed 68 projects
- Estimated value of volunteer hours was \$205,428
- Collected 5.4 tons of compost
- Disposed of 3.07 tons of trash



Food Drive

- Collected 6,893 lbs of food
- Distributed to three food pantries
- 32 companies participated
- 65 collection sites



Kindergarten Countdown

- 97 students enrolled in 8 classrooms
- · Achieved 86% attendance rate
- Pre Literacy skills increased 18%
- Name writing ability increased 44%



Persistence Pays Off

- Provided 348 financial literacy lessons to students
- Provided nearly \$35,000 in emergency financial assistance to students
- Provided nearly \$22,000 in mental health assistance to students
- 99% of students persisted (completed a certificate, graduated with an associate or bachelor's degree, or reenrolled in the fall semester to continue their education)



Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

- · Completed 2,988 tax returns
- \$2.3 M in tax refunds returned to the community
- \$815,724 in tax preparation fees saved


